DEBATERS OF THE WORLD UNITE IN WALES



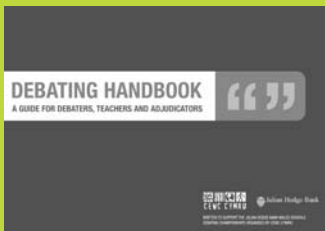
In an exciting move towards encouraging global dialogue, Wales will host the World Schools Debating Championships in 2006. The Welsh Centre for International Affairs, of which CEWC-Cymru is the schools arm, will have overall responsibility for the Championships, working with members of the Wales Debating Federation to ensure that it makes a lasting impression on all those who participate.

We anticipate that debaters, coaches and adjudicators from over 30 countries will take part in the competition. Although participants will be based in Cardiff, we intend to bring world-class debates to schools and colleges throughout Wales. In addition to the debating element of the event, participants will sample Welsh culture, language, natural beauty and hospitality.

CEWC-Cymru has taken a team of 5 debaters to the global competition for the past 13 years, selected through our Wales Schools Debating Championships. Although the title of World Champions has eluded Welsh debaters so far, participation has had a positive impact on the individuals involved, many of whom have gone on to high-profile professional careers, as well as being very skilled university debaters.

Kate Wolstenholme: looking forward to developing democracy in schools

Since the beginning of the school year, Kate Wolstenholme has been working as CEWC-Cymru's Assistant Education Officer. Part of her role is to co-ordinate *Training for Democracy*, our second project funded by the Electoral Commission. Following on from last year's *Your Say* work, she is developing training for teachers in the field of education for democracy and the establishment of successful school councils.

Kate studied English Literature at the University of Wales, Aberystwyth, before training to be a teacher at Oxford Brookes University. She has taught at a number of schools in the Oxford area and specialises in education through the medium of drama. ENQUIRING MINDS

CEWC-Cymru has recently begun its Philosophy for Children (P4C) project. Our Education Officer, Martin Pollard, has been trained by SAPERE (Society for the Advancement of Philosophical Enquiry in Education) to engage young people in philosophical discussions, and has conducted a number of these in Blaenau Gwent primary schools. He has also visited P4C practitioners in Cumbria, Northumberland and Clackmannanshire to share ideas and compare existing methodologies. Ultimately, CEWC-Cymru will produce classroom materials and teacher training resources, demonstrating how P4C can be used to advance Values and Attitudes in the PSE Framework.

SHARING IDEAS

CEWC-Cymru was one of a number of Welsh organisations represented at *Educating the Responsible Citizen*, an international conference held in Cardiff from 4 to 6 November. The event showcased recent initiatives in citizenship education, including our work on human rights and other global issues. It also provided an opportunity for colleagues from Scotland, England, Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland to share their experiences and ideas.

CEWC-Cymru provides workshops and talks on a range of global issues, including children's rights, democracy, fair trade and refugees. This service is free for member schools and colleges, with a more limited service available to non-members.

UNDERSTANDING CONFLICT

There is still time to enter *Wales and the Spanish Civil War*, CEWC-Cymru's current competition for students. We are asking young people aged 11 to 18 to consider the role played by Welsh men who fought for the International Brigade during the 1936-39 war in Spain, and to do one of the following:

- 1) Write an essay on the involvement of Wales in the war; *or*
- 2) Write several diary entries as if you were a Welsh member of the International Brigade, describing events and how you think you might be feeling; *or*
- 3) Many people who went on to be famous in other fields were involved in the International Brigade. Research one of these and write about their involvement and the impact it had on their lives.

Prizes of £150, £100 and £50 will be awarded for the most effective or evocative entries. The competition is supported by the Welsh Centre for International Affairs, which has a fund for this, established by former International Brigaders from Wales. It marks the UK International Brigade Memorial Trust's annual meeting, held in the Temple of Peace in October. For more information, contact cewc@wcia.org.uk.

FOCUS ON... MODEL UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL CONFERENCES

Each year, CEWC-Cymru holds 7 Model United Nations meetings around Wales. These simulations of international discussions provide a valuable opportunity for 14-18 year olds to improve their skills in communication, negotiation, research and global citizenship. This year we are focusing on the role of the Security Council, the UN body with responsibility for peace and security. In the Autumn term, students considered the situations in Afghanistan and Sudan, with the objective of forming internationally acceptable solutions to the challenges facing these nations, while working within the structure and rules of Security Council procedures.

DADLEUWYR Y BYD YN DOD YNGHYD YNG NGHYMRU



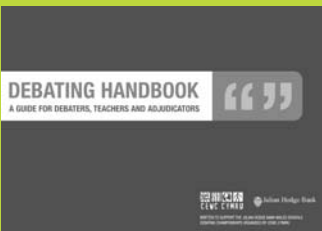
Dyma gam cyffrous tuag at annog cyd-draffod byd-eang: yn 2006, Cymru fydd yn croesawu Pencampwriaeth Ddadlau Ysgolion y Byd. Canolfan Materion Rhyngwladol Cymru (mae CEWC-Cymru yn adran ysgolion iddi) fydd yn gyffredinol gyfrifol am y Bencampwriaeth, gan weithio gydag aelodau o Ffederasiwn Dadlau Cymru i sicrhau y bydd yn gwneud cryn argraff ar y rhai fydd yn cymryd rhan.

Rydym yn rhagweld y bydd dadleuwyr, hyfforddwyr a beirniaid o dros 30 o wledydd yn cymryd rhan yn y gystadleuaeth hon. Kate Wolstenholme: edrych ymlaeth i ddatblygu democratiaeth mewn ysgolion

Ers cychwyn y flwyddyn ysgol, bu Kate Wolstenholme yn Swyddog Addysg Cynorthwyol gyda CEWC-Cymru. Rhan o'i gwaith yw cydlynu *Hyfforddiant mewn Democratiaeth*, ein hail broject dan nawdd y Comisiwn Etholiadol. Gan ddilyn ar sodlau gwaith *Dweud eich Dweud* y llynedd, mae hi'n datblygu hyfforddiant i ysgolion ym maes addysg ddemocratiaeth a sefydlu cyngorau ysgol llwyddiannus.

Yn ddiweddar mae CEWC-Cymru wedi dechrau ei brosiect Athroniaeth i Blant (P4C). Hyfforddwyd ein Swyddog Addysg, Martin Pollard, gan SAPERE, y Gymdeithas er Hyrwyddo Ymholi Athronyddol ym myd Addysg (Society for the Advancement of Philosophical Enquiry in Education) i annog pobl ifainc i drafod yn athronyddol, ac mae wedi cynnal nifer o'r trafodaethau hyn mewn ysgolion cynradd ym Mlaenau Gwent. RHANNU SYNIADAU

Roedd CEWC-Cymru ymhlith nifer o sefydliadau Cymreig a anfonodd gynrychiolwyr i gynhadledd ryngwladol a gynhaliwyd yng Nghaerdydd rhwng 4 a 6 Tachwedd. Roedd y digwyddiad yn llwyfan i fentrau diweddar ym maes addysg ddinasyddiaeth, gan gynnwys ein gwaith ar hawliau dynol a materion byd-eang eraill. Roedd hefyd yn gyfle i gydweithwyr o'r Alban, Lloegr, Gogledd Iwerddon a Gweriniaeth Iwerddon i rannu eu profiadau a'u syniadau.

Mae CEWC-Cymru yn cynnig gweithdai a sgysrsiau ar amrywiaeth o faterion sydd o bwysigrwydd byd-eang, gan gynnwys hawliau plant, democratiaeth, masnach deg a ffoaduriaid. Mae'r gwasanaeth hwn yn rhad ac am ddim i ysgolion a cholegau sy'n aelodau, ac mae gwasanaeth cyfyngedig ar gael i eraill.

DEALL GWRTHDARO

Nid yw'n rhy hwyr i anfon eich cynnig i gystadleuaeth gyfredol CEWC-Cymru i ddisgyblion. Ei phwnc yw *Cymru a Rhyfel Cartref Sbaen*. Rydym yn gofyn i bobl ifainc rhwng 11 a 18 oed i ystyried y rhan a chwaraewyd gan ddynion o Gymru a fu'n ymladd ar ran y Frigâd Ryngwladol yn ystod y rhyfel yn Sbaen ym 1936-9, ac i wneud un o'r canlynol:

- 1) Ysgrifennu traethawd am ran Gymru yn y rhyfel; *neu*
- 2) Ysgrifennu sawl cofnod mewn dyddiadur fel pe baech yn aelod Cymreig o'r Frigâd Ryngwladol, gan ddisgrifio digwyddiadau a sut, yn eich barn chi, y byddech yn teimlo; *neu*
- 3) Chwaraeodd llawer o bobl a aeth ymlaen i fod yn enwog mewn meysydd eraill ran yn y Frigâd Ryngwladol. Ymchwiliwch i hanes un ohonynt ac ysgrifennwch am eu gwaith gyda'r Frigâd a'r effaith a gafodd ar eu bywydau.

Rhoddir gwobrau o £150, £100 a £50 i'r cynigion mwyaf effeithiol neu atgofus. Noddir y gystadleuaeth gan Ganolfan Materion Rhyngwladol Cymru, o'i chronfa a sefydlwyd gan gyn-aelodau o'r Frigâd Ryngwladol o Gymru.
